Service Animals

A service animal is a dog or miniature horse that is individually trained to perform a task or service for a person with a disability.





NOT ALLOWED: Pets, assistance, companion, and emotional support animals

As an employer of a retail food establishment, you may ask a customer: 1. "Is the animal required because of a disability?" 2. "What task does it perform?"

If any service or non-service animal is out of the control of the owner or is not housebroken, that animal *can* be asked to leave the facility. However, the facility or business owner must make its services or goods available to the person with a disability.
